



BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENTS

IT IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY THAT EXHIBITORS MAINTAIN GOOD BIOSECURITY PRACTICES WHILE AT THE EVENT AND COMPLY WITH THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS

ALL LIVESTOCK MUST BE IN GOOD HEALTH, EATING NORMALLY AND NOT SHOWING SIGNS OF ILLNESS OR DISEASE AT LEAST 3 DAYS PRIOR TO ENTRY TO AND ARRIVAL AT THE YEPPOON SHOW

ALL LIVESTOCK MUST ARRIVE CLEAN AND FREE OF ORGANIC MATERIAL

ALL VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT MUST ARRIVE CLEAN AND FREE OF ORGANIC MATERIAL E.G. NO EXCESS MANURE AND MUD THAT COULD CONTAIN DISEASE OR PESTS

ANY SIGNS OF DISEASE AT THE EVENT MUST BE REPORTED TO A STEWARD AND IF DEEMED NECESSARY EXAMINED BY THE ON-CALL VET AT THE OWNER'S EXPENSE.

IN THE EVENT OF A SUSPECTED LIVESTOCK DISEASE EXHIBITORS MUST FOLLOW ANY INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN BY A STEWARD.

IF DIRECTED LIVESTOCK WILL BE MOVED TO AN ONSITE QUARANTINE AREA FOR TESTING AND TREATMENT.

IN THE EVENT OF ANY LIVESTOCK MOVEMENT RESTRICTIONS THE EXHIBITOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CARE /MAINTENANCE AND COSTS OF LIVESTOCK INCLUDING FEEDING AND WATERING FOR THE DURATION OF THE RESTRICTION.

ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE A HEALTH DECLARATION FORM AVAILABLE FROM THE SHOW OFFICE.

- INDEMNITY: The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through, or by any exhibit or animal, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnified against legal proceedings arising from such accidents.
- LOSS BY DISEASE: The entry form will be taken as a guarantee that animals therein are free from all disease so far as is known by the owner. In the case of an infectious disease being spread through, or by an exhibit, the Exhibitor will be held responsible.
- FIRE: Precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property at the Show, but all Exhibitors will not be insured at the cost of the Society.
- NO ENTRIES WILL BE RECEIVED EXCEPT ON THE CONDITION THAT: All disputes, objections and protests shall be decided by the Management Committee of the Show Society whose decision shall be final.
- NO ENTRY WILL BE RECEIVED FROM ANY PERSON DISQUALIFIED BY THE QUEENSLAND CHAMBER OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES: No entry will be accepted during the period of disqualification. Should any such entry be accidentally accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void and the entry fee will be forfeited.
- PRIZES NOT CLAIMED: All Prize monies, including Prize monies for Ring events, must be collected at the Showgrounds before the Show ends. Prizes or money not collected, and for which no claim has been made, will be considered to have lapsed after three (3) months, and will become the property of the Society.

The Next Generation ANZAC Biscuit Competition

Open for competitors aged between 18 and 40 years old as of 1st May in the year of competition, this is a test of skills in the fine art of baking ANZAC biscuits.

Follow the set recipe in accordance with the Queensland Ag Show rules.

Anzac biscuit recipe

(Ingredients for 24 biscuits)

• 125gm butter, chopped

- 1 cup plain flour
- 1/2 tsp bicarb soda
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 2 tbs golden syrup
- 2 tbs boiling water
- ³⁄₄ cup desiccated coconut


Method:

Combine butter and golden syrup in a pan, stir over heat until butter is melted. Stir in combined soda and water, then remaining ingredients. Mix well. Drop rounded teaspoons of mixture about 4 cm apart on greased oven trays and flatten slightly.

Bake in a slow oven for about 20 minutes or until slightly brown. Cool on tray.

Rules

- Biscuits are to be 5cm in diameter. Biscuits must be crisp.
- The competition begins at the local show. Winners of the ANZAC biscuits at the local show competition are eligible to enter the Sub Chamber competition.



- Only one entry from each Sub-Chamber is permitted to enter the State Finals.
- State Finalists will have their ANZAC Biscuits displayed at the EKKA.
- 4 biscuits are to be presented for judging.
- (Competitors must use the ANZAC biscuit recipe from QLD Ag Shows See also pg 32)

General conditions:

Admission fees: \$15.00 per adult

\$7.00 for schoolchildren / per day.

Camping fees:

\$15.00 per vehicle / per night. (Receipt to be displayed on windscreen) NB. There will be limited supervised day parking only in the show ring. All overnight campers to be outside of ring area.

Biosecurity horse health declaration:

Current biosecurity horse health declaration forms must be lodged for each and every horse prior to nominating.

Stables will be available for day / overnight use. Bookings to the Secretary. Please advise if you require stables for your horses.

Heating / stoves:

The use of primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or naked lights, is strictly prohibited in the stalls.

Electrical fencing is not permitted.

Electrical leads:

Must be inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and have a current tag test in the last 6 months.

Power boards:

Must be of approved external industrial quality.

Double adaptors:

Are not allowed to be used in any circumstances.

No smoking will be permitted on the grounds.

Yeppoon Showgrounds have been designated as a smoke-free area.

Indemnity:

The society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through, or by any exhibit or animal, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the society blameless and indemnified against legal proceedings arising from such accident.

Prizes not claimed:

All prize monies, including prize monies for ring events, must be collected at the showgrounds before the show ends. Prizes or money not collected, and for which no claim has been made,

will be considered to have lapsed after three (3) months, and will become the property of the society.

No entry will be received from any person disqualified by the Queensland Chamber of **Agricultural Societies:**

No entry will be accepted during the period of disqualification. Should any such entry be accidentally accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void and the entry fee will be forfeited.

Loss by disease:

The entry form will be taken as a guarantee that animals therein are free from all disease so far as is known by the owner. In the case of an infectious disease being spread through, or by an exhibit, the exhibitor will be held responsible.

Fire:

Precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property at the show, but all exhibitors will not be insured at the cost of the society.

The society reserves the right to add, delete or cancel any event.

Regulations for ring events:

• Ages of all horses will date from the 1st August. Every horse foaled before then shall be deemed 1 year old on the 1st August next following.

• Maiden shall be horse that has never won a first prize in a similar show competition i.e., hacking, jumping etc. In all maiden competitions, horses must be maiden at the time of starting, not the time of nomination. If, by the time of judging, the stewards have not been notified by the exhibitor of a mistake in this regard, the competitor shall be disqualified from receiving any prize money, or dealt with in any other way at the discretion of the chief steward.

• Novice shall be a horse that has never won a first prize at a royal show or champion at any agricultural show.

• Current registration papers must be carried by competitors in all led-in or registered classes. Official EQ measuring cards/Show Horse Committee QLD cards will be acceptable for measuring purposes and must be available for scrutiny.

• Exhibitors, if called upon by the committee, shall prove the correctness of their certificates of entry by statutory declaration or other means.

• Approved head-gear: Riders must wear protective head-gear to the current Australian, European, or American standard. The retaining harness must be secured and fastened at all times. Riders without approved head-gear shall be ineligible to compete until it is rectified.

• Riders remember "ride for safety first": You must ride at your own risk. The society will not be held responsible for damage or injury to horses, riders or spectators.

• Riders and attendants are reminded that they must be neatly and appropriately attired.

• Helmets: The AS/NZS 3838 (AU) and ARB HS 2012; PAS 015 (UK); ASTM F 1163 (USA); VGI (Europe) & manufacture date post 2012. All helmets must be tagged.

• A horse or pony may compete in either junior or open jump events but not both.

• Stallions will be allowed to compete in special classes and senior jumping events.

• All horses/ponies must parade before the judge when required and must be ready to enter the ring five minutes before the start of any event.

• Ladies and gentlemen, mean 18 years and over on the first day of the show - this does not include sporting or jumping events.

• All children (under the age of 13 years) competing may be accompanied by an adult while in the ring or show area.

• The society is affiliated with EQ.

• **Prize money** can be collected from the show office half an hour after the judging of an event is completed, if relevant information is submitted to the office, in that time.

• All entries / tickets to be purchased at the Dragon's Den, on both days.

• Consolation classes will be post entry with no nomination fee.

• All hacks shall be 15hh or over. All Galloways over 14hh & under 15hh.

• All ponies not exceeding 14hh.

• No stallions are allowed in any junior rider class or junior jumping.

• Horses and ponies must be in show condition and riders must be neatly attired. There is no restriction on the age of the rider in open Galloway or pony hack events.

• Judges may re-classify any horse that they consider to be in the wrong class. Any person, whether competitor or not, who in the opinion of the committee behaves in an offensive manner, inside or outside the ring to any official or judge, shall be liable to disqualification from further competition for three (3) years.

• **Local classes** are confined to persons and horses resident in the Livingstone Shire Council area – proof required. Any person including a competitor or exhibitor who wishes to lodge a protest, shall do so in writing with a twenty dollar (\$20.00) bond within fifteen (15) minutes of completion of the event.

• If classes clash, competitors must choose which class he or she will compete in, as the judging of a class will not be held up.

• **Drugs:** The Yeppoon & District Show Society Inc. reserves the right to randomly drug test horses nominated for the 2025 show.

These regulations to be read in conjunction with such rules and regulations as may, from time to time, be issued or amended by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies.


